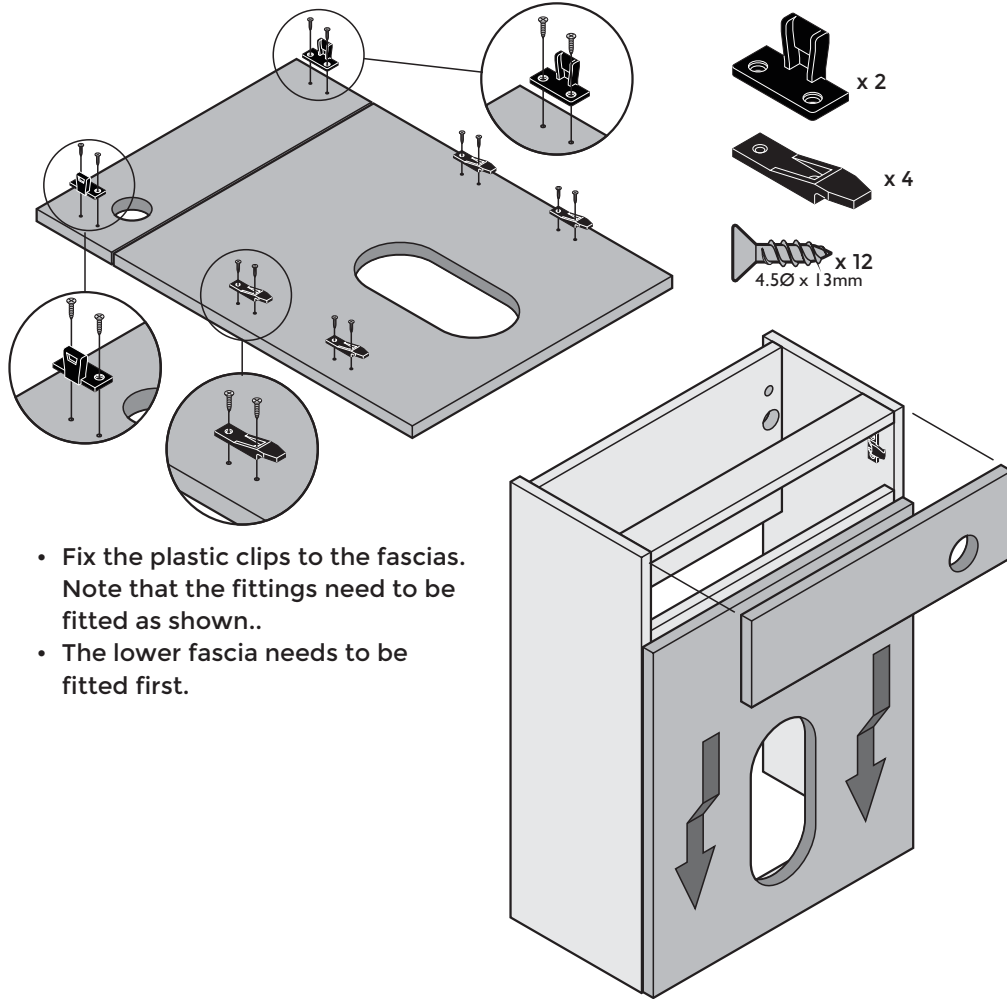


Step 3 - Fit fascias



- Fix the plastic clips to the fascias. Note that the fittings need to be fitted as shown..
- The lower fascia needs to be fitted first.

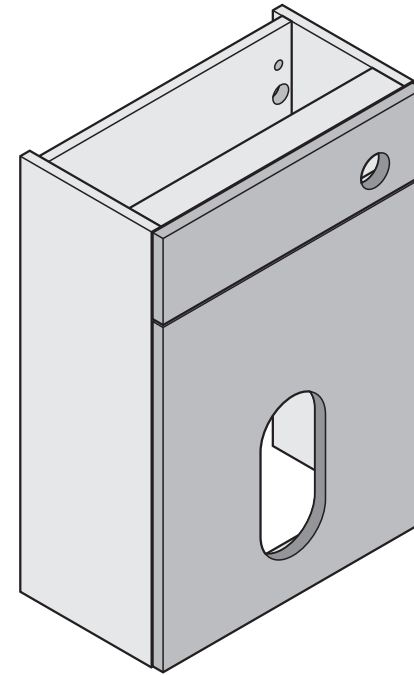
Care and Maintenance

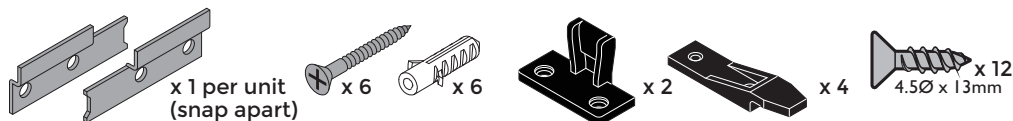

Contact your point of purchase if an imperfection is found.

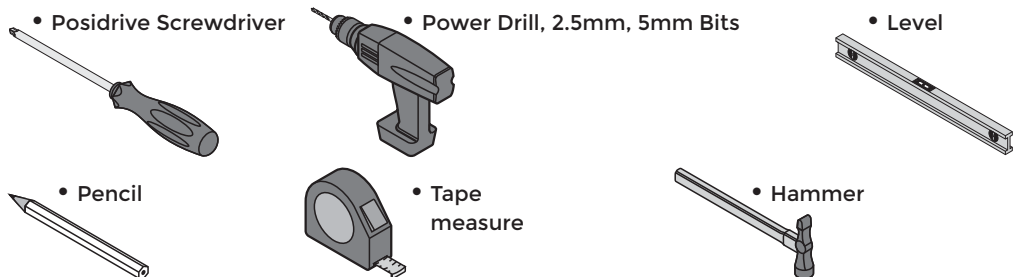
General Safety Instructions

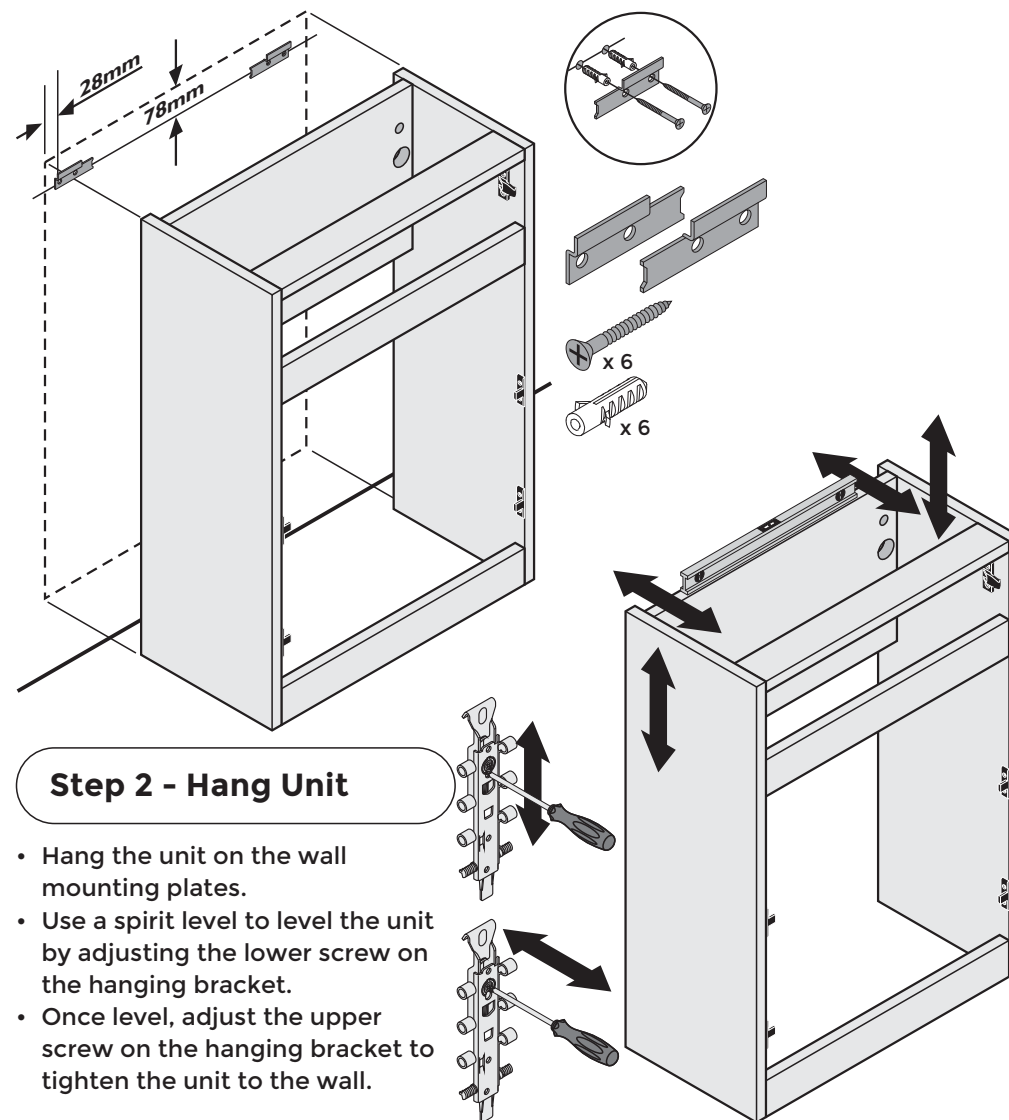

Step 1 - Wall Fixings

- Decide on the height of the vanity unit and use a spirit level to draw a horizontal guideline.
- Mark out the internal dimensions of the unit making sure the plates are within the internal dimensions of the unit by 2-3 mm.
- Using a cordless drill along with the wall plugs and screws provided, fix the plates in place.
- If the wall is not solid, you will need to use your own fixings. Ensure that they are adequate to support the total weight of the unit as stated on the packaging.

INSTALLATION OF EQUIPMENT

WARNING:

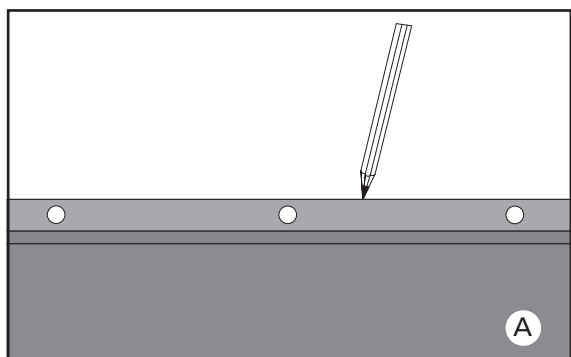
Do not use mole grips on plastic nuts.

Do not use sealing compound as damage may occur to plastic components.

Do not overtighten plastic nuts.

If the cistern is being used as front access do not use the lid fixing screws.

The fixings supplied with this cistern will NOT suit every type of material or construction



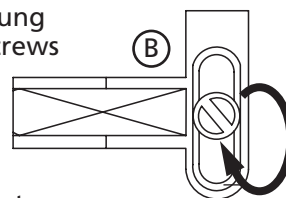
Line markings of cistern as drawn in picture 'A'

CISTERN BODY

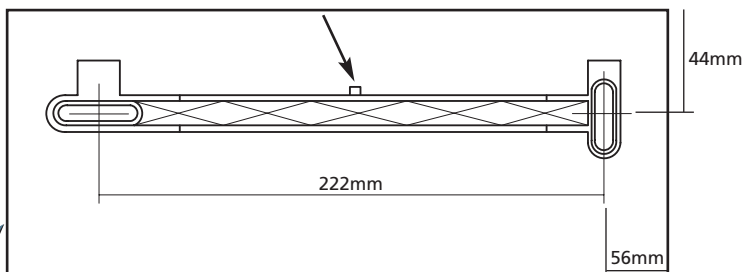
Note: Maximum dimensions of flushpipe establish where cistern is to be located relative to the WC pan. Hold cistern in place, ensure cistern is level using a spirit level, and mark where the cistern is to be located, as shown in picture A. Mark top and sides of cistern and fit wall hung fixing bracket to the dimensions shown below.

PLEASE NOTE – If the furniture unit is front access only allow a 50mm gap from the underside of the unit top to the top of the cistern to allow easy access for the flushing valve.

Using a screwdriver, lock the wall hung fixing bracket into position using screws provided, as shown in picture 'B'

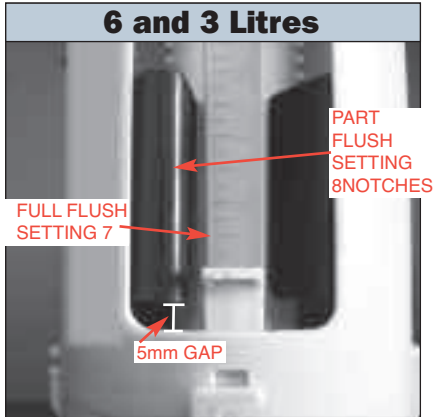


When fitting wall hung fixing bracket, ensure that the arrow indicated points towards wall/cabinet



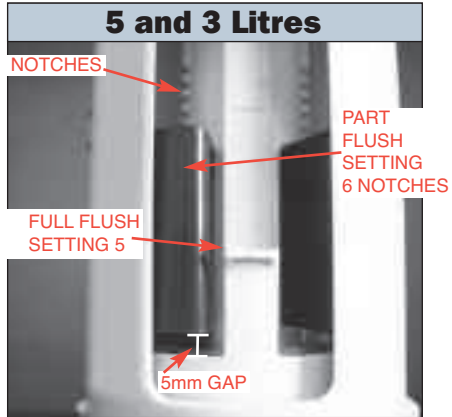
FLUSH VALVE SETTINGS

6 and 3 Litres



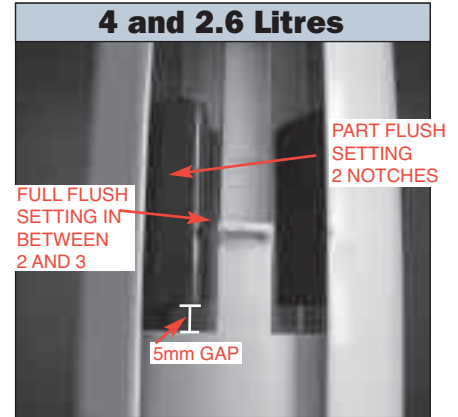
The valve is pre-set to flush 6 and 3 litres.

5 and 3 Litres



To change to 5 and 3 litre flush move the full flush adjustment slide to 5 and the part flush float to 6 notches.

4 and 2.6 Litres

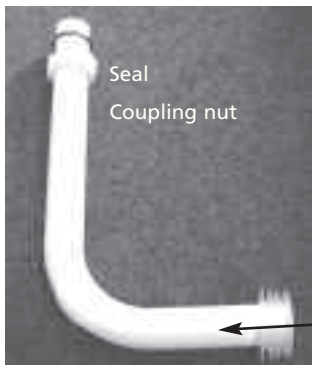
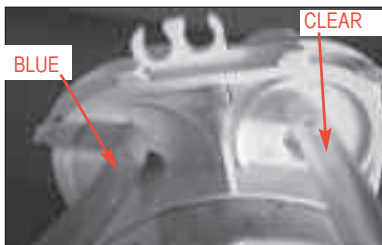


To change to 4 and 2.6 litre flush move the full flush adjustment slide to 2-3 and the part flush float to 2 notches.

Make sure the grey float is always 1 notch (5mm) above the full flush adjustment slide or the valve will stick open.

Final Commissioning of Flushing Valve

1. Check the backnut/base seal are water tight.
2. Check the hose is connected to the flushing valve correctly.
3. To clean seal unclip valve and remove seal as shown below.



1.5" Flushpipe

Place the coupling nut, followed by the seal, on the flushpipe, secure coupling nut hand tight, tighten further if necessary, fit finned flushpipe connector on to flushpipe, insert into W.C. pan.

Finned flushpipe connector



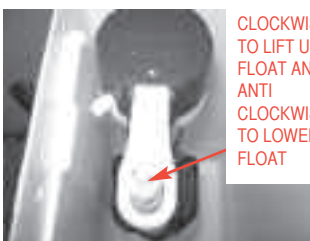
2" Flushpipe

Place the coupling nut, followed by slip ring, then the seal on the flushpipe, ensure the seal has the bevelled edge pointing towards the end of the flushpipe, insert the flushpipe up to the stops in the valve base then secure coupling nut hand tight, tighten further if necessary, fit finned flushpipe connector onto 1.5" end of flushpipe, insert into W.C. pan.

Final Commissioning

Ensure that all pipework is clear of debris before connecting to the inlet valve.



CLOCKWISE TO LIFT UP FLOAT AND ANTI CLOCKWISE TO LOWER FLOAT

Once installation is complete, turn on water supply and allow the cistern to fill. Adjust the water level by rotating the threaded rod, the water level needs to be set to the 6 litre water line marked on the cistern.



HOLD FLOAT DOWN

Hold the inlet valve float down, causing the cistern to internally overflow, ensure overflow is capable of discharging the incoming water, if necessary reduce flow by partially closing the isolation valve (not supplied).

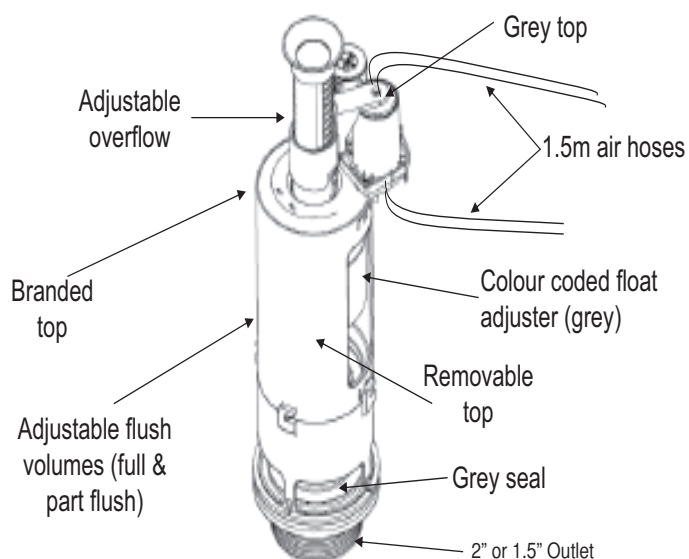

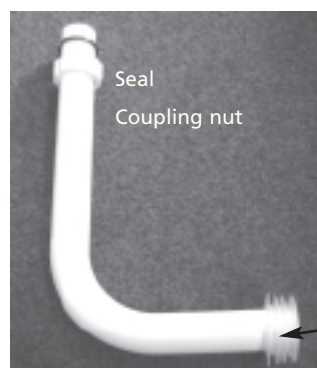

KAYLA Flushing Valve



1.5" and 2" Outlet Valve

Insert threaded section of the valve into cistern, with base seal on the inside, secure with back-nut hand tight, tighten further 1/2 turn using a spanner, check for leaks, tighten further if necessary.



1.5" Flushpipe

Place the coupling nut, followed by the seal, on the flushpipe, secure coupling nut hand tight, tighten further if necessary, fit finned flushpipe connector on to flushpipe, insert into W.C. pan.

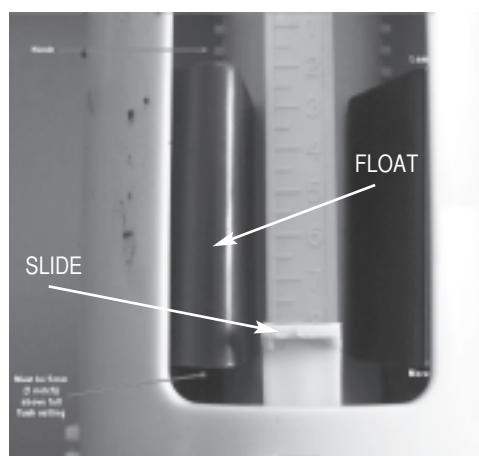
Finned flushpipe connector



2" Flushpipe

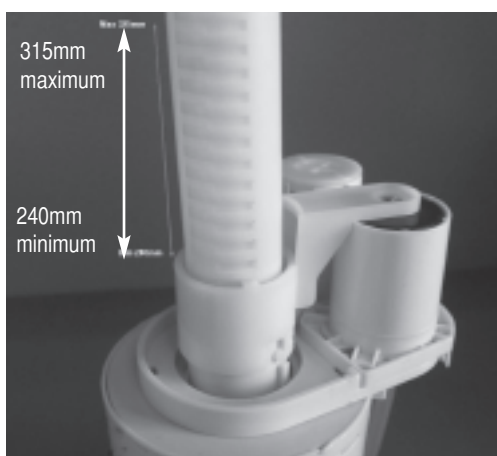
Place the coupling nut, followed by slip ring, then the seal on the flushpipe, ensure the seal has the bevelled edge pointing towards the end of the flushpipe, insert the flushpipe up to the stops in the valve base then secure coupling nut hand tight, tighten further if necessary, fit finned flushpipe connector onto 1.5" end of flushpipe, insert into W.C. pan.

Finned flushpipe connector

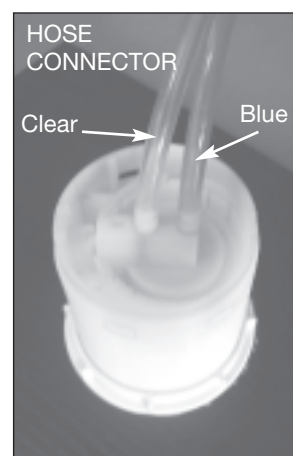


To adjust the full flush, move the slide down for more and up for less. Part flush move the float up for less and down for more. Always keep the part flush float 1 notch above the full flush setting.

DO NOT GO BELOW SETTING 8



The overflow is adjustable from 240mm to 315mm in height. Clip and lock the overflow 20mm above the waterline in the cistern. Ensure the overflow is capable of discharging the incoming water.



Connect the hoses to the button, blue hose to the end of the barrel nozzle, clear to the centre nozzle. Make sure the hose connection is firmly on the nozzle and in the correct order or the part flush will not work.



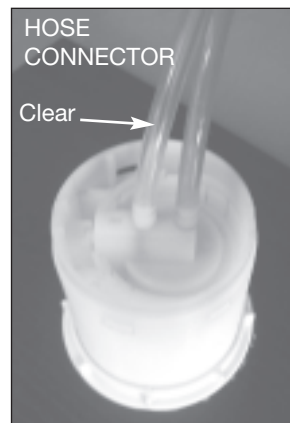
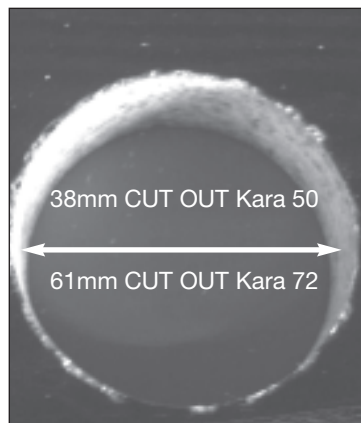
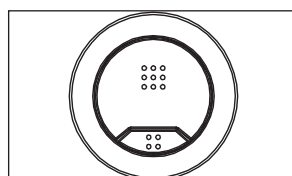
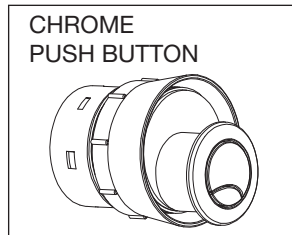

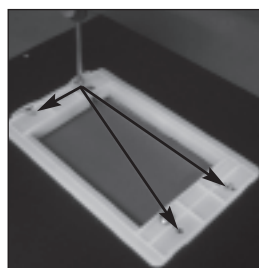
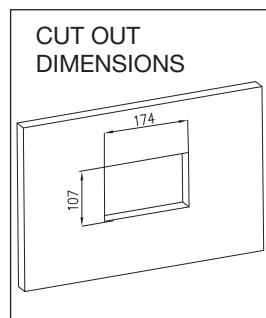
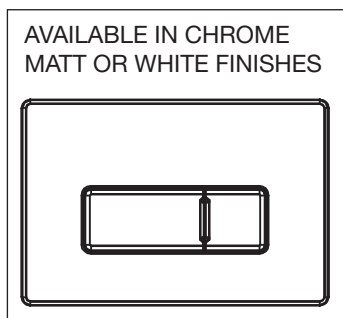
KARA 50mm & KARA 72mm DUAL FLUSH BUTTONS



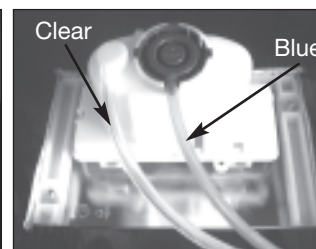
DUAL FLUSH BUTTON ASSEMBLY KARA 50mm & KARA 72mm Buttons

1. Cut out 38mm hole for Kara 50 and 61mm hole for Kara 72.
2. Put the threaded tail of the button through the hole and hand tighten the backnut.
3. Connect the hoses to the button, blue hose to the end of the barrel nozzle, clear to the centre nozzle.

SINGLE FLUSH BUTTON ASSEMBLY KARA 50mm & KARA 72mm Buttons

1. Cut out 38mm hole for Kara 50 and 61mm hole for Kara 72.
2. Put the threaded tail of the button through the hole and hand tighten the backnut.
3. Connect the hoses to the button, clear to the end of the barrel nozzle.

TROUBLE SHOOTING GUIDE FOR THE INLET VALVE / PNEUMATIC FLUSHING VALVE / PUSH BUTTON / PUSHPLATE

THE INLET VALVE WILL NOT LET WATER INTO THE CISTERN

- Check the water supply and isolation valve are turned on.
- Make sure the inlet valve float has free movement and is not in shut off position.
- Check the inlet valve for debris, remove diaphragm and clean with warm soapy water.
- **Is the water supply mains or tank fed?** Inlet valve working pressure is 0.1 bar (1 metre of head) to 14 bar.

THE INLET VALVE WILL NOT SHUT OFF

- Check the inlet valve for debris.
- Make sure the inlet valve float has free movement and is not jammed.
- **Is the water supply mains or tank fed?** Inlet valve working pressure is 0.1 bar (1 metre of head) to 14 bar.

THE FLUSHING VALVE KEEPS RUNNING/FLUSHING

- Unclip the flushing valve from the base remove the seal and check for debris, clean with warm soapy water and put the seal back on the flushing valve then clip the flushing valve back into place.
- Make sure the flushing valve is set to the correct setting as stated in the instruction leaflet. **The grey float must always be 1 notch (5mm) above the white slide and the white slide never set below 8 or the valve will stick open.**
- Check the flushpipe has not been set too far into the base of the valve.

THE PUSH BUTTON / PUSHPLATE WILL ONLY WORK ON FULL FLUSH OR NOT FLUSH

- Check the hoses have been put on in the correct order as per the instruction leaflet.
- Make sure the hoses are correctly connected to the button and flushing valve nozzles as per the instruction leaflet.

TROUBLE SHOOTING GUIDE FOR THE INLET VALVE / CABLE OPERATED FLUSHING VALVE / BUTTON

THE INLET VALVE WILL NOT LET WATER INTO THE CISTERN OR IS TAKING A LONG TIME TO FILL

- Check the water supply and isolation valve are turned on.
- Make sure the inlet valve float has free movement and is not in shut off position.
- Check the inlet valve for debris, remove diaphragm and clean with warm soapy water.
- **Is the water supply mains or tank fed?** Inlet valve working pressure is 0.1 bar (1 metre of head) to 14 bar.

THE INLET VALVE WILL NOT SHUT OFF

- Check the inlet valve for debris.
- Make sure the inlet valve float has free movement and is not jammed.
- **Is the water supply mains or tank fed?** Inlet valve working pressure is 0.1 bar (1 metre of head) to 14 bar.

THE FLUSHING VALVE KEEPS RUNNING/FLUSHING

- Unclip the flushing valve from the base remove the seal and check for debris, clean with warm soapy water and put the seal back on the flushing valve then clip the flushing valve back into place.
- Make sure the flushing valve is set to the correct setting as stated in the instruction leaflet.
- Check the flushpipe has not been set too far into the base of the valve.
- **Make sure the cable is not kinked or stretched as this will make the flushing valve stick open.**

THE PUSH BUTTON KEEPS STICKING / NO FLUSH

- Make sure the cut out for the button is 40mm.
- Make sure the button is correctly connected to the button housing.
